In Maths this week we have been finishing our topic on measure. The children looked at capacity and volume, having great fun exploring terms such as full, half full, nearly empty and empty. We have also been looking at our number bonds. These are the two digits which add together to make a number e.g. 8 and 2 is a number bond of 10. The children have been challenged to learn these by heart, in order to help them with their calculations in the future. Maybe you could play games at home to help consolidate this learning.

In English the children were asked to do an independent piece of writing which recounted their favourite part of Year One so far. They were able to draw on a range of topics that they loved including WW1, The Great Fire of London and of course the most recent Art Gallery experience!
