

Good morning everyone

We have been very lucky so far to have had no positive cases of Covid in school - however, we are aware of other schools where there have been cases and classes have had to be sent home. I just wanted to reassure you all that if a class or a year group are required to self-isolate at home we are ready to send home remote learning for your children. This will be delivered through the use of Tapestry, Seesaw and by email. Your child's class teacher will be organising this.

I also want to assure you that we do realise that if a child is at home isolating, then the rest of the family will be too, and it may therefore be challenging for you to deliver the home learning. We will totally understand if this is the case and, as we did in lockdown, we ask only that you do the best you can. What we need to remember, especially for our children in years 1 and 2, is that the other year group class may still be in school and so we want to try and ensure that the class at home don't fall behind too much.

We also appreciate that your family may well be having to share lap tops etc, so we will make sure that the majority of the work can be done without these devices. If you have issues printing out work then just ask and we will get some hard copies to you - somehow! We do have one 'spare' lap top which was given to us by the government for this situation so if you would like to ask to borrow it for the time your child is off, that can be arranged.
